# RESTORATION, DIGNITY,

For Daniel, life began in a healthy family. "My childhood was happy to average." Sadly, when he was 18, his mother died. Things gradually slipped away after that. Tragically, his father succumbed to alcoholism and died five years later. Daniel says eventually everything was gone, their family home, cars, and finances.

Doing what he needed to do to get through these tough times, Daniel eventually found someone, got married and settled down. They had a son. But things didn't last, unfortunately. He found himself losing his home and his family again. When COVID-19 hit, he lost his job. Now he had no income and nowhere to go.

Right around Thanksgiving 2020, Daniel came to Good Samaritan Rescue Mission in need of shelter and food. Our doors were open for him. He arrived at the Mission feeling angry, defeated, and lost. "I was running from my responsibilities and my worldly outlook gave me the justification for thinking God wasn't real," he shares. Daniel will tell you he knew of God but even recently, still considered himself an atheist.

It wasn't long after he arrived at the Mission, he recognized the 'comfort in the structure and support'

that he received from the Mission and staff. Even though his mind was clouded by anger, hurt and betrayal, the Mission soon made an impact on him. He realized the staff members each had their own strengths which he could trust. There was a balance with the men's shelter staff that he noticed. They are 'strict but compassionate and patient'.

"I am now a believer in God and Jesus Christ," he happily shares. "I try to put myself in His hands." He even bought himself a Bible and he reads it. Daniel is going into the Army. He is excited and encouraged with his future. "I will be able to buy a house and make my life better for my son," he says, "I want to clean up my own 'room' and then help in the community and beyond."

Daniel is now focused on taking care of himself. He has come full circle from life starting out 'happy and healthy.' Today he is happy with his direction in life. He is making better choices; eating well, exercising, he quit smoking, and is following a desire to do "whatever I can do to help more people. The kindness of others has not only nourished my body, but my spirit as well. For that, I am forever thankful."

Allow me to challenge you. These are the days that people should see the evidence of God's love in our lives. #### REUNIFICATION

To reunite youth with a parent or other suitable family member.



#### EDUCATION

The SYS team will work with youth and families to strengthen the youth's connection to their school and services the school provides.



#### LIFE SKILLS

The objective is to enhance the youth's ability to meet ageappropriate milestones.



The Shelter is licensed by the State of Michigan and received widespread community support. It will; provide emergency shelter for up to 30 days; it is a voluntary program for youth and their families and will house up to five males and five females.
