Growing up in Wellsville, NY, life for Paul, number 5 in the line of 7 children, was a combination of good and tough times. "Looking back, it was somewhat below average due to the number of siblings, my place in the rank and file, and the lack of stable income." Paul says his parents were hard-working, adventurous, and God-fearing. When he was younger, however, Paul witnessed his father struggle with the effects of being a war veteran. Memories of this, along with having low self-esteem as a teenager, wasn't helpful in Paul's emotional growth and stability.



Although he attended a faith-based school through the 8th grade where he learned about God's love for him, Paul still struggled for a 20-year period when he turned to drugs and alcohol. "My problems started in 1967 and gradually evolved." At 18 years old, and in poor physical condition, Paul left high school and entered the army for 11 months. From there he worked as a rail car builder all while hiding his addiction to drugs and alcohol. Although a concerned friend encouraged him to stop drinking, Paul said, "I knew what I needed to do, but I didn't want to do it."

The necessity of getting out of a dangerous living situation is what brought Paul to the doors of Good Samaritan. "It took two failed attempts (speaking of his first two mission stays) in 2021 plus 6 more months". However, during his third stay at the mission this past winter, Paul finally understood what he had to do. "When I paid closer attention, I noticed a change in my behavior and attitude." Once Paul felt resigned to the fact that he needed help, he was thankful for the structure the mission staff and programs offered him. Now understanding the benefits of having a safe place to sleep, shower and eat, he is thankful for the advice and encouragement he received.

Since moving out of the mission, Paul is feeling more spiritually fit than ever and hopeful about his future. Landing in local housing, he says, "My apartment is awesome!" Paul plans to continue to attend AA meetings, volunteer at a weekly food give-away and continue to re-connect with 2 of his siblings.

ACROSS THE BAY

Across the Bay is where we share with you highlights about our Saginaw Shelter, City Rescue Mission.



The City Rescue Mission kitchen remodeling project launched in March 2022 and reopened August 22. During the six-month remodeling project meals for guests were prepared at the Good Samaritan Rescue Mission and transported to City Rescue Mission.

The new 1600 sq ft layout makes meal preparations and dish washing much more efficient. One of the additional benefits of the kitchen remodel was how the construction team was able to correct some drainage issues that caused flooding in the kitchen area during heavy rain downpours. Often during long periods of heavy downpours, the drains could not keep up and water backed up into the kitchen area.



The Samaritan Award is presented to one whose charitable acts have somehow stood out among hundreds of kindnesses. The 2022 Samaritan Award was presented to Marcia Letson.

Marcia started volunteering at Good Samaritan Rescue Mission before it opened, when she learned that the shelter needed donations and volunteers. Hearing about the need, Marcia volunteered to help in the kitchen since she enjoyed baking. She would get there about 5:30 am to help prepare breakfast for the guests. That was approximately 15 years ago. Today, Marcia still volunteers in the kitchen. Mission guests enjoy her signature desserts.
